Moment of truth: April 2021 – setting up the Austrian Mandated Organisation

The European Open Science Cloud (EOOSC) envisions establishing a European data infrastructure, integrating high-capacity cloud solutions, eventually widening the scope of these services to include the public sector and industry. In November 2018, the European Commission launched the [European Open Science Cloud \(EOOSC\)](#) at the University of Vienna. Two years later the EOOSC Association was established as a legal entity on 29th July 2020 with four founding members. In January 2021 TU Wien created a new organizational unit, the *EOOSC and International Liaison Office*, based at TU Wien Bibliothek – and in February 2021 the Austrian Mandated Organisation applied for membership in the EOOSC Association. But, what does it mean to implement the EOOSC at a domestic level, and how does it fit with the now launched EOOSC Association? How can relevant Austrian communities engage with the EOOSC? How can Austrian EOOSC Stakeholders contribute to the structuring of these co-creation processes? How can the addressed communities help to prepare the transition to a new "Stakeholder-based governance" at domestic level?

This presentation offers some reflections for a better understanding of the realization of the EOOSC at the present stage at a local level, including the newly established Austrian EOOSC Mandated Organisation and the EOOSC Support Office Austria.

The EOSC Partnership-structure 2021+ Governance of the co-programmed Partnership



- A contractual agreement (MoU) will be signed between the EOSC Association (currently being set up) and the Commission.
- The Commission and the EOSC Association will establish a Partnership Board as the main mechanism for dialogue in order to reach the objectives of the Partnership.
- A Steering Board (composed of representatives of Member States and Associated Countries) will be set up outside of the EOSC Association to provide advice at policy and strategy level.



Advisory groups of EOSC AISBL (status FEB2021)

The Advisory Groups will provide advice on the fulfilment of the Association's mission and their outputs will contribute to the preparation of documents such as the Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda and multi-annual roadmap. Directors will be nominated to act as a liaison between AGs and the Board to ensure an effective two-way communication.

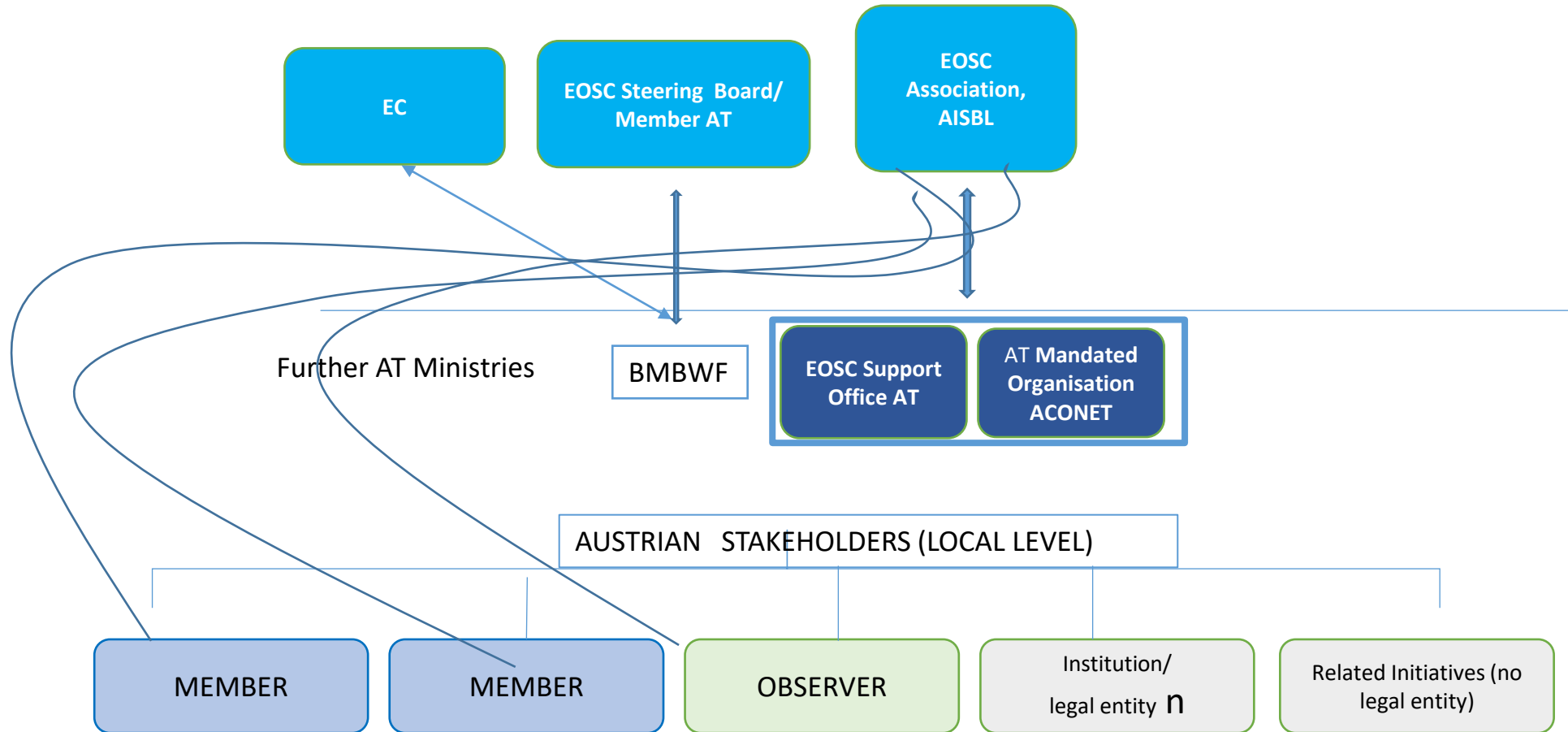
Development of the MoU

“Austrian EOSC Mandated Organisation” as a joint undertaking and the “EOSC Support Office Austria”

MoU - This includes defining the following: the relationship of the partners to each other, the regulation of operations, the institutions and the management including the rights, duties and responsibilities with respect to the initiative, and to determine the results and

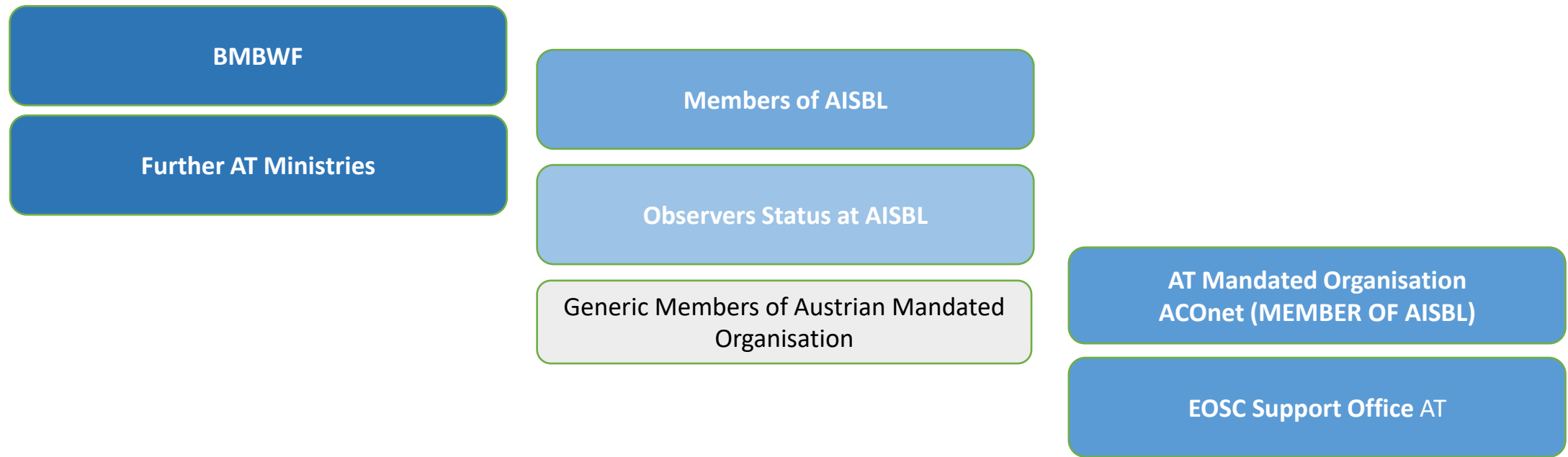
to preserve free access to the results of joint work carried out within the initiative and relevant information with respect to the assignment of intellectual property rights.

Governance model (compliant with EOOSC and EOOSC Association)

The internal management structure of the Partner Network includes four institutional bodies and a Reflection Group (former *“Austrian EOOSC Café”*).

Roles and responsibilities within the project are regulated through a (MoU)

The internal management structure of the partner community consists of the following institutions:

- (a) The General Assembly acts as the representative body and as the final body responsible for decision-making.
- (b) The Management ensures the optimization of processes and acts as an intermediary and coordinator between the institutions of the Community Partner and the partners.
- (c) The Steering Committee sets the basic orientation of the project.
- (d) The Synergies Teams bears the responsibility for expertise in each discipline/WG.
- (e) The Reflection Group provides external influence and stimulus

Governance Model



The **Reflection Group** is a team of experts of multi disciplinary organisations (such as industry, politics, and science) that provides insight and expertise to the different organisational units of the initiative Austrian Mandated Organisation. The Reflection Group actively participates in the definition of long-term development strategies and provides motivation for their implementation. The Reflection Group only provides recommendations, however.

It promotes the networking with similar Austrian and European institutions working in similar projects, and ensures that Austria is connected with the rest of the world in research matters, promotes access to decision-makers in Austria and in the European Union, and facilitates access to qualified and structured data and information.

Trusted Space:
WIKI

A centralised web based Wiki, available to all partners, provides the organisational framework for the pooling of resources, the centralisation of current information about the project status, meetings, documentation as well as stimulating the exchange of experiences and knowledge.

The Wiki is regulated by clearly defined Terms and Conditions of use

Guiding principles - Summary

Openness: open communication between all partners in the partner network.

Culture of Dialogue: Encouraging a "culture of dialogue" to promote institutional networking and exchange of ideas.

Access: The partners are committed to a free access to the results of the joint operation in the project.

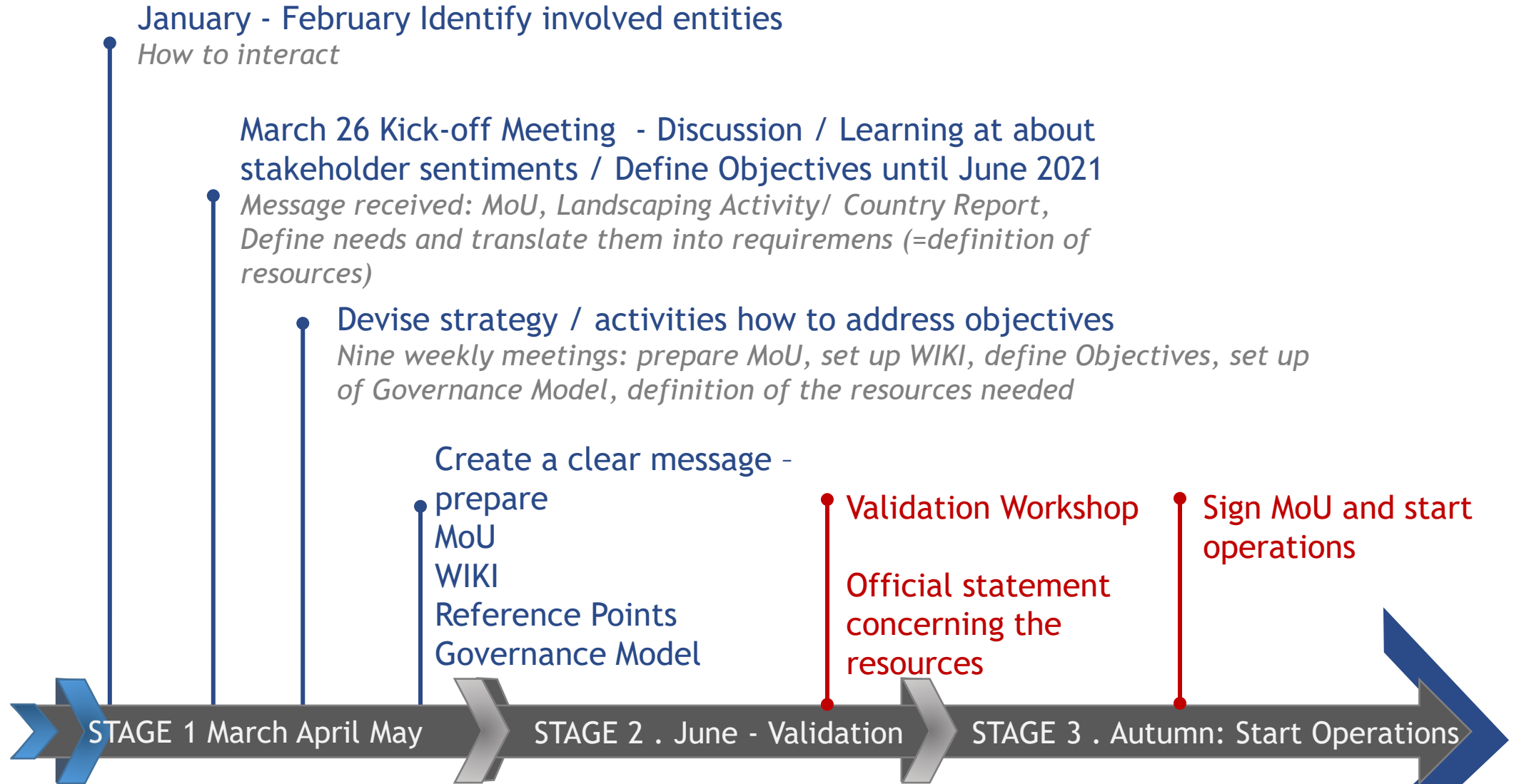
Ownership of rights: The project partners ensure the sustainability of the results by a regulated ownership of rights within and outside the network.

Recognizable roles: regulated relationship between all project partners by means of defined organizational units and processes. Roles and responsibilities are clearly visible from inside and outside.

Structured approach: The operation of the work packages is defined by controlled sessions, responsibilities, well defined voting, and communication.

Clear information infrastructure: The project partners have at their disposal a common, nation-wide information infrastructure established in the form of a Wiki.
