Researchers

- ✓ Only Early-Stage Researchers (**ESRs**):
 - ≤ 4 years of research experience
 - no PhD yet
- ✓ Mandatory **trans-national mobility** at the time of recruitment.
- ✓ Recruitment: **3 to 36** months after the project starts
- ✓ Researcher-months: requested in proposals

What are Individual Fellowships?



Individual trans-national fellowships to the best and most promising **experienced*** researchers

(* with PhD or 4-year full-time equivalent research experience)

An Experienced Researcher may submit only one proposal to this call for proposals.

- ✓ **Secondments** of 3 – 6 months in Europe (MS or AC), for greater impact
- ✓ Specific eligibility criteria
- ✓ Career development

What are Individual Fellowships?



An Experienced Researcher may submit only one proposal to this call for proposals.



European Fellowships

For fellows coming to or moving within Europe
duration 12-36 months for CAR
duration 12-24 months for other EF



Global Fellowships

For fellows from Europe going to third countries (12-24 months) & returning to Europe (12 months)



Total duration 24-36 months

What is a "Project"?



Typical training activities may include:

- ✓ **Training-through-research:** individual personalised action
- ✓ Hands-on training activities for developing **scientific** (new techniques, instruments) and **transferable skills** (proposal preparation to request funding, IPR management , task coordination, supervising & monitoring, exploitation of research results)
- ✓ **Inter-sectoral or interdisciplinary transfer of knowledge** (e.g. through secondments)
- ✓ Organisation of **scientific/training/dissemination events**
- ✓ Communication, **outreach activities** and horizontal skills
- ✓ Training dedicated to **gender issues**

Proposal Part A (Submission Forms)



Proposals must be submitted electronically using the Participant Portal.

Part A: administrative details

Section 1 – General Information

Section 2 – Administrative data of participating organisations (supervisor(s), researcher)

Section 3 – Budget: information on the duration (person-months) to calculate the total requested EU contribution.

Section 4 – Ethics: identifies any ethical aspects of the proposed work.

Even if there are no issues, you must simply confirm that none of the ethical issues apply to the proposal.

Section 5 – Call specific questions request declarations related to eligibility and personal data, together with questions on any secondment in Europe.

The "core" of the proposal – the structure below is mandatory
!There is no cover page or table of contents anymore!



Objective: to provide specific support to excellent researchers not funded through the IF call to undertake an individual fellowship in a widening country

Budget: EUR 6 million from the "*Spreading Excellence and Widening Participation*" Work Programme.

Widening countries:

Member States: *Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia and Slovenia.*

Associated Countries: *Albania, Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Faroe Islands, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Georgia, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Tunisia, Turkey and Ukraine.*

1st WF call 2018



Objective: to provide specific support to excellent researchers not funded through the IF call to undertake an individual fellowship in a widening country

Budget: EUR 5 million (respectively EUR 6 and 7 million for 2019 and 2020) from the "*Spreading Excellence and Widening Participation*" Work Programme.

Proposals considered for WF funding if:

- **admissible and eligible for MSCA IF**
- **obtained a score of 70% or above in the MSCA IF call but was not funded under that call**
- **have not opted out from consideration for WF call**



Scope

- ✓ international, intersectoral and interdisciplinary **research training**, as well as transnational and cross-sector **mobility** of researchers at all stages of their career
- ✓ Possibilities of synergies with structural funds
- ✓ Opportunities for **researchers from all countries**
- ✓ Researchers to comply with the mobility rules of the MSCA
- ✓ Open and transparent recruitment, vacancies widely publicised

Expected Impact

- ✓ exploit synergies between European Union actions and those at regional, national, and international level
- ✓ leverage funding and combat fragmentation



- ✓ **Budget:** € 90 Million in 2019
- ✓ Maximum **€ 10 Million per single applicant** per call
- ✓ Duration of projects: minimum 3 years, maximum 5 years (including the time taken to publish calls and recruit researchers)
- ✓ **Fellowships: minimum 3 months**
- ✓ EU contribution to cover **living allowances for researchers and management costs**
- ✓ Minimum living allowance fixed in the WP

COFUND - HOW



- ✓ **Applicant** = Mono-beneficiary (EU MS or AC institutions) with max. 10 million EUR per call
- ✓ **Project duration** = between 3 and 5 years
- ✓ **Recruitment** = EURAXESS

✓ **HSCiRO – HANDLE WITH SCIENCE**

- the general objective : to promote the results of scientific research that supports people and humanity (vaccines, space technology, materials science, fundamental science).

- held in 6 major cities in Romania, considered to be the regional cultural and administrative capitals of our country: Bucharest, Iasi, Cluj, Timisoara, Sibiu, Craiova

✓ **R4H1819 – RESEARCHERS FOR HUMANITY 2018-2019**

- the general objective: to highlight what science and researchers do are useful for daily life, and their life is as everyone's else

- main novelty of the project - the component of private research through private companies and NGOs that are implementing various research projects



FIGURES FROM 2018 EDITION

- 55 proposals funded across H2020 countries
- 371 cities hosted events and 33 544 researchers were actively involved
- 2 155 of these researchers were beneficiaries of H2020
- 1.5M attendees were reported

Evaluation Process



- Each proposal is read and evaluated by **three evaluators** in an individual and independent manner. Each evaluator prepares an *individual evaluation report*.
- The three evaluators discuss together to reach a **consensus** on the final comments and score, and prepare a *consensus report*, containing relevant elements from the three individual reports.
- The consensus score determines the position on the ranking list.
- Applicants receive their **evaluation summary report**.

Evaluation & Award Criteria (II)



A weighted total score of the scores of the three individual criteria will be calculated and converted into a percentage of the maximum score.

An overall threshold of 70% will be applied to the total weighed score. Proposals under the threshold will be rejected.

Evaluation & Award Criteria



0 – Proposal fails to address the criterion and cannot be assessed due to missing or incomplete information.

1 – Poor. The criterion is inadequately addressed, or there are serious inherent weaknesses.

2 – Fair. The proposal broadly addresses the criterion, but there are significant weaknesses.

3 – Good. The proposal addresses the criterion well, but a number of shortcomings are present.

4 – Very good. Proposal addresses the criterion very well, but a small number of shortcomings are present.

5 – Excellent. Proposal successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the criterion. Any shortcomings are minor.


Romanian participation (since 2014 – H2020)


Romanian participation (coordinator or participant) in MSCA - all years







Romanian nationals in MSCA - all years






Romania in MSCA- Individual Fellowships




Success Rate of RO hosts




Romania in Widening Fellowships

- 17 out of the 773 proposals are from RO = ~2%
