- Main result Ministerial communique 2024
- We adopt the statements on the fundamental values annexed to this Communiqué. While each value is
- 43 essential, all six of them need to be implemented as a coherent whole. As a reliable monitoring of their
- implementation within all our education systems is required, we welcome the work on creating a technical
- 45 monitoring framework, and we ask the BFUG to report back to us at our 2027 Ministerial Conference.

T3.1 Developing a piloting methodology – January 2024

- The team will propose a methodology to apply the developed indicators at national level (type of data /sources /validation procedures/ methods/planning /a general framework)
- This step will also include **choosing the four countries** where to test the indicators.
- The piloting/testing phase is needed in order to evaluate how the monitoring framework can be implemented at the national level in order to better refine the mechanisms.

T3.2 Organising two workshops with stakeholders and public institutions –May 2024

 For an in-depth understanding of perceptions on the proposed indicators but also for promoting fundamental values in the national context (as an important Bologna commitment), two workshops will be organised.

T3.3 - Drafting four piloting reports - June 2024

- For this activity, national experts will be involved together with the content experts.
- The role of the national expert is to provide data sources, to validate the data and the content, to facilitate information and discussions with key personnel from that country and to explain the very specific national policy context.
- The piloting reports will be presented to the FVWG and will tackle mainly methodological aspects regarding monitoring fundamental values at the national level.

T4.1 - An analysis of the existing options that can help in building open and flexible learning paths

- The main objective of the study to analyse the existing practices and barriers linked with reshaping academic curricula through microcredentials and open learning pathways, based on current research and discussions on the topic, and especially on the engagement of UNICA Network universities included in the study.

T4.3 - Developing a grid for programme design - January 2024

- A grid for designing and implementing an educational programme based on micro-credentials, which could lead to flexible and open joint / multiple degrees built on a micro-credentials philosophy.
- The grid will consider the most relevant categories, aspects and indicators for designing a flexible educational programme on microcredentials: modularisation, stack ability, recognition of prior learning, non-formal learning experiences, certifications interconnections, digital credentials, etc.
- The grid will support academics developing innovative learning programmes, as well as HEIs across Europe addressing an institutional approach on this aspect.
- Status Finalized

T4.4 - Piloting reports – June 2024

- The grid developed in the project will be piloted in at least 3 universities especially through those UNICA universities that are also members in European Universities Alliances.
- Curriculum experts from UNICA universities will simulate the application of curriculum grid to understand and analyze its impact and link it with the current tendencies on curricular design and innovation at European scale.
- Based on these simulations and piloting phase, using observation and experiments, a piloting report will be developed.
