

# Advancing with the reform of research assessment systems

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## Need for reform of research assessment

- To reflect evolving research processes
  - ✓ Digital transition; Iterative and recursive; Collaborative and open
- To reflect increasing demands on research
  - ✓ Societal, environmental, economic challenges; Diversity of outputs
- To move away from inappropriate uses of journal- and publicationbased metrics
  - ✓ Rewards quantity and publication venue rather than quality; does not reward sharing, collaboration and outputs other than publications
- To further support the quality of research and the attractiveness of research environments
  - ✓ Requires a system and cultural change, involving institutions, funders and researchers


"Which types of academic work matter most for research careers?"

## Common vision

Assessment of research, researchers, and research organisations, **recognises the diverse outputs, practices and activities** that maximise the quality of research and resulting impacts.

This requires basing assessments primarily on **qualitative judgement**, supported by **responsible use of quantitative indicators.** 

#### 4 core commitments:

- 1. Recognise the diversity of contributions to, and careers in, research in accordance with the needs and the nature of the research
- 2. Base research assessment primarily on qualitative evaluation for which peer-review is central, supported by responsible use of quantitative indicators
- 3. Abandon inappropriate uses in research assessment of journal- and publication-based metrics, in particular inappropriate uses of Journal Impact Factor (JIF) and h-index
- 4. Avoid the use of rankings of research organisations in research assessment

## An Agreement and Coalition

### Commitments for changes

- ✓ Previous recommendations and declarations: not successful enough in triggering changes
- ✓ Agreement including principles, commitments and a timeframe

### Space for mutual learning and collaboration

✓ Supports and facilitates the implementation of the Commitments by the members

### Driven by stakeholders


✓ Respects the autonomy, profile and strategic goals of research organisations and allows for differences in implementation

#### Critical mass of stakeholders

- ✓ Avoids disadvantage of first mover
- ✓ Various types of research organisations involved; coherence across the various assessment systems



## Agreement signatories (as on 11 November 2024)




Universities and their associations

## Role of the European Commission

- Evolution of assessment practices for EU funding of R&I
- Synergies with other EU policy initiatives (e.g. ORE, EOSC, Open Science, European Universities Alliances, Researchers)



- Co-chair CoARA Working Group on "Improving practices in the assessment of research proposals"
- Member of other CoARA Working Groups
- Observer in CoARA Steering Board



 Foster global alignment and cooperation with other regions worldwide



## Some changes to assessment already implemented for the main Work Programme part of Horizon Europe

#### Award criteria:

- ✓ open science practices, and gender dimension in R&I content, under "excellence";
- ✓ diversity of research results from previous work and expertise to practice open science, under "quality and efficiency of the implementation"

#### Application and reporting forms:

- ✓ describe up to 5 relevant achievements in applications;
- ✓ deliver Gender Equality Plans;
- ✓ deliver Data Management Plans;
- ✓ describe open science practices;
- ✓ report on broad spectrum of research results

#### Peer-review process:

- ✓ Not asking applicants information relating to JIF, journal prestige, H-Index, etc.
- ✓ Instruct peer-reviewers to disregard the JIF of publications listed by applicants as major achievements
- Set up Open Research Europe where each article has a dedicated page of article-level metrics

## CoARA Working Group on the assessment of research proposals

- Improve practices in the assessment of research proposals, ultimately supporting higher quality and more impactful projects
  - ✓ In line with the principles and commitments of the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment
  - ✓ While respecting the autonomy of each member

#### Lines of work

- ✓ Criteria and processes for the selection of research projects and innovative procedures (WP1).
- ✓ Selection of and guidance to **reviewers** on responsible research assessment practices (WP2)
- ✓ Information requested from applicants (WP3)
- Co-chaired by the European Commission, the German Research Foundation (DFG) and Knowledge Foundation Sweden (KKS)


